

Review: Infinitives

- An infinitive is a verbal noun. Treated as a *neuter* noun.
- Tense in the infinitive pertains to *kind of action*, not time.
 - Present: linear action
 - Aorist: undefined
 - Perfect: completed with a continuing result
- The subject of an infinitive is *in the accusative case*.
